

FRANCE HÔTEL DU PETIT MOULIN, PARIS

Anything designed by the great Christian Lacroix is going to be a hit with us, and this Paris bolthole is no exception. The 17 rooms are a riot of colour, pattern and toile de Jouy, and even though it opened in 2005, the style hasn't dated. In case you didn't guess from the old boulangerie sign hanging outside, it is housed in a former bakery - the city's first - and still retains some of the 17th-century features, such as the original shop front. HOTEL DU PETIT MOULIN Quirky, decoratively riotous and fun, it's everything you want your Paris hotel to be



This pretty, Victorian-era boutique hotel is privately owned, and it shows in the cosy atmosphere and homely touches, such as the library and games room. Interiors take inspiration from local culture – the Royal Albert Hall, as well as the V&A, Science and Natural History museums, are all nearby – with botany, birds, music, geometry and astronomy-themed rooms. Decor is fresh and pretty, with Victoriana mixed with contemporary art pieces. The award-winning Science Afternoon Tea is a big deal here: planetor rocket-shaped cakes, anyone? And down in the cellar, Apero serves up inventive Mediterranean/fusion dishes to a lively crowd. And if there is a better hangover cure than Sunday's Pranzo della Nonna – granny's brunch - we have yet to discover it. Doubles from £216, room only; ampersandhotel.com

USA THE WHITBY, NEW YORK

The Whitby, like its nine Firmdale siblings, is big on art, design and texture, so expect bold prints, vibrant colour and lots of talkingpoint art works. The Midtown location is handy for MoMA, too. The 87 rooms are light and spacious, some with floor-to-ceiling windows and most with freestanding baths in luxurious bathrooms. You'll find a reading room (take your pick of around 2,500 books), a 24/7 gym, two screening rooms and a lively bar/ restaurant, which is a big hit with the locals, creating a neighbourhood vibe. NETHERLANDS KIMPTON DE WITT, AMSTERDAM

This luxury arty hotel, opposite the central station, is just a few minutes' pedal (on the free bikes) away from the pretty canals. Converted from three period houses, inside is all modernist cool, while the courtyard garden and lobby wall of florals creates an urban-oasis feel. The best of the 274 rooms are the nine suites with terraces, but all are large and bright, many with Eschercube tiling in the bathrooms – our favourite design treat in a hotel awash with style. *Doubles from £152, room only;* kimptondewitthotel.com.
